





























Editorial Notes:

- $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$ no rest in original
- $\underline{\mathbf{B}}$ extra half rest in original
- $\underline{\mathbf{C}}$ sharp not in original but shown in figured bass
- $\underline{\mathbf{D}}$ only one quarter rest in original
- **<u>E</u>** This measure is problematic. It would sound better to our ears if 4th note of 1st alto were not sharp. However, the sharp is clearly shown in figured base (but 1st tenor and 2nd alto are singing natural!
- **<u>F</u>** Rest is missing
- $\underline{\mathbf{G}}$ D is not sharped here but is in the continuo
- $\mathbf{\underline{H}}$ original is a whole note then half rest
- \underline{J} original d is not sharped in continuo but is in the tenor

All tempo marks are added by the Editor as a suggestion and are not part of the original Greene publication. Likewise Slurs and other performance marks may not be original. Mike Wallen
